Today's Gospel Reading: John 10: 1-11

Additional Readings: Psalm 23, Acts 2:42-47, 1 Peter 2:19-25

Time to Reflect:

In the reading from John's Gospel, you may have noticed that, when he answered the Pharisees, Jesus chose to use the image of a Shepherd. It was image which they would have recognised. Not only would they have seen the many shepherds on the hills around Galilea, but they would have also known about the way shepherds had featured in the history of their nation. They would have known about shepherds from their Scriptures. They would have known, just as we do, the Song of David which begins "the Lord is my shepherd".

Jesus, as well as David, realised that everyone was aware how a shepherd looked after his flock. How he would nurture them, protect them, keep them safe and how every one of his sheep was important to him. The sheep needed nothing else other than their shepherd to keep them safe.

Take a moment to reflect on how you feel?

Do you feel safe or do you fear the future in these times of lockdown and social isolation? or do you feel comforted, protected, safe as you walk this "dark path"?

Later, in chapter 15 of John's Gospel, Jesus uses another image to explain to the disciples about the love of God and how he cares for each one of us.

He tells them "I am the vine; you are the branches...abide in me as I abide in you".



It is a wonderful image, which I hope speaks to you just as it speaks to me, that whatever happens, God is there. He is with us, just as the shepherd is always there for his sheep. Our Lord cares for us, and more than just being near us, "He abides in us".

At this time, when we may find ourselves worrying, fearful about the future, concerned about what will happen next, we can take comfort that our Lord, who is our Good Shepherd, will be with us. We can rejoice that we live and abide in our Lord's love.

He is with us now and always!

Let us pray this morning for our world, especially those who cry out in pain.

We pray for those who are facing the future with uncertainty, for those who are anxious about tomorrow, and who doubt their

own ability to cope with the current situation.



We think of those who are suffering throughout our world, for those who long for the fighting to end, for those who have no food, no water and nowhere to shelter.
