This short act of worship has been prepared for use while we are unable to gather together to worship. If you are well enough we invite you to spend a few moments with God, perhaps at 10:30am, the usual time our worship begins, knowing that other people are also sharing this act of worship with you.



As we come to worship you may like to have a time of silence and light a candle. Let us remember that wherever we are, God is with us.

Adoration

Reading: John 14:15-21

'If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate, to be with you for ever. This is the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him. You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

'I will not leave you orphaned; I am coming to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me; because I live, you also will live. On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. They who have my commandments and keep them are those who love me; and those who love me will be loved by my Father, and I will love them and reveal myself to them.'

Reflect

Jesus promises he will never leave his disciples orphaned.

In these days of pandemic, we have, for a time, lost something of our freedom, our social interaction, our physical connection to each other. While we keep connected to each other in other ways to mitigate some of that loss, the loss is there all the same, and at times, we can feel lonely or orphaned.

Just as Jesus assures his disciples, Jesus assures us too – he will never leave us, and his Spirit is coming (has come!) and he lives with us.

Yes Jesus lives with us. He comes for you.

With a deep longing to know you, and the deep longings of your heart.

How does that make you feel?

Spend a few moments noting down those feelings.

What deep longings are there in your heart today?

Write them down and offer them to Jesus. Listen for is voice.
